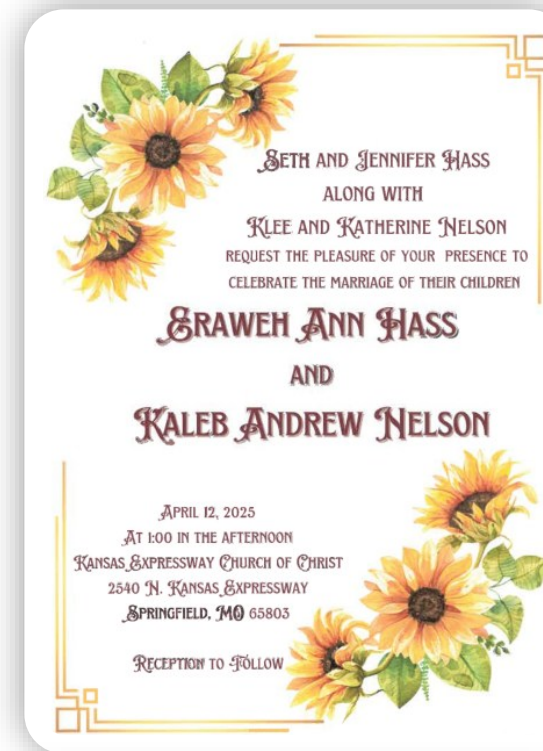

Elders' Corner:

Dear brothers and sisters,

We began a study in our High School Boys to Men split class this past week on the subject of unselfishness. We talked about how babies can be very selfish, for when they want something, they want it right then. They will cry and cry until you give them what they want, whether that is food, a diaper change, to be held, etc. As those babies begin to grow, you must start the process to teach them to be unselfish. You are teaching them lots of things, such as trusting you, being obedient and respectful, but you are also teaching them to be unselfish. You are teaching them to share their toys with others, to share their mommy and daddy with their siblings, to not interrupt, I could go on and on. Much of that boils down to teaching them to be unselfish. Children that are allowed to grow up being selfish end up being selfish adults and selfish Christians. While we all enjoy having our own way sometimes, and I think that is ok; we must be willing to consider the needs of others before ourselves (Phil 2:3-4). It makes me think of the song "None of Self and All of Thee". The chorus starts off with "All of self, and none of Thee (selfish)", but as we transform ourselves into a new creature, we find ourselves growing, maturing, and hopefully becoming less selfish. We transition from "All of self, and none of Thee", to "Some of self and some of Thee", to "Less of self, and more of Thee", and finally "None of self and all of Thee (unselfish)". The song is about giving our lives over to Christ, but part of giving our lives to Christ includes being unselfish and considering the needs of others (Matt 25:31-46).

We have seen a lot of our church family struggling lately with their health. Some have ended up in the hospital, or rehab centers, or homebound. While I know some folks request no visitors, and we want to be respectful of their wishes, there are many who could really use some encouragement by simply giving up some of our time, and go visit them. What a perfect opportunity to show our children, our friends, our brothers and sisters that we are willing to be unselfish with our time as we visit the sick (Matt 25:36). I encourage us all to consider the song "None of self and All of Thee".
