Elders' Corner:

Greetings brethren. We want to take this opportunity to thank all of you who helped with our efforts to replace flooring at the building. We are finally seeing the fruits of our efforts. As most of you know, our current carpet has been in place since we moved into the building in 1978. Over the past few years, we have been able to lay aside funds to allow the improvements you now see. We are hopeful the auditorium will be completed by the time you receive this message.

Some of you have asked what more is needed. We have already paid 75% of the expense for carpeting the auditorium, foyer and main hallway. We have the remaining 25% in our building fund which will be paid upon completion. The following approximate amounts are what will be needed to complete the rest of the building:

First floor classrooms and offices: \$13,800
Fellowship hall: 15,400
Upstairs classrooms and stairs 6,500
Total needed: \$35,700

We will continue to finish the project as funds allow. Occasional special gifts and 5th Sunday contributions are earmarked for the building fund. However, if anyone would like to contribute to this effort and help us reach our goal sooner, please see one of us. We will have roughly \$7100 in the building fund when we make the final payment for this round of carpeting.

Thank you to all who have helped with moving pews and cleaning in connection with the carpet project. We are overwhelmed by your show of support, and deeply appreciate it.

Remember our sick and those who have lost loved ones in your prayers. We look forward to seeing you at our next scheduled assembly.
