Finally, I also heard about the storms you have had today and yesterday in Missouri. I was surprise to hear of all the damage, but am thankful to God that all are safe. Lord willing Trey and I will be home Friday night. Please keep us in your thoughts and prayers. Lord willing we will worship with you all Sunday. We love and miss you all!
