

We are glad to have Steve as part of our Bible Institute of Missouri staff, helping to instruct our preacher students and pre-

I thought I would follow-up my last article with a short note about our trip to the Ivory Coast at the end of August. One of the congregations we have spent much time with, the Dimbokro church of Christ, gave Tiffany and I a letter asking for assistance in constructing a bathroom/shower for the church. Currently, the preacher Georges Bonadventure, along with his family, live in the rooms attached to the church building, and they have no bathroom or shower facility. The bathroom consists of a couple pieces of L-shaped tin that provides a little privacy to the toilet bowl that is mounted to a concrete slab. As there is no running water to the toilet, to flush, you simply bring a bucket of water with you and pour the water into the toilet bowl. Several church members signed the letter, asking for assistance to build a bathroom/shower facility that could be used by those that live there all the time as well as to be used by the church. After discussing with the other elders, we have agreed to send them \$500 to be used for building a bathroom facility. They will need to collect several thousand dollars to afford to build the facilities. Helping them meet this need is very dear and special to Tiffany and I. Thank you all for your continued contributions that are used to provide our brethren assistance in matters such as this as well as for evangelism, edification, and benevolence.
